Officers Absent: Dolores Renner, Aleksandra Owczarek, and Lin Holzinger

Call to order at 10:37 a.m.

Motion: Karen Fidel motioned and Linda Melvin seconded to approve the August 25, 2014 Board Meeting Minutes. The Minutes were originally acknowledged and reviewed by the board members via e-mail.

Motion passed: In Favor 13; Against 0; Abstain 0.

Treasurer's Report - Linda Melemed

There was a discussion of increasing expenses and decreasing income becoming a concern. Linda noted that sales were up for August and September, and we would end the year with a small profit.

Linda suggested that the financials show the membership income in the proper fiscal year per year, so that it can be tracked for budgeting purposes. For deposits of membership income made in the prior fiscal year, they will be placed on the balance sheet as a prepaid until September of the proper fiscal year.

Motion: Karen Fidel motioned that membership income will be recognized in the proper fiscal year. Lynn Ely seconded.

Motion passed: In Favor 13; Against 0; Abstain 0.

Motion: Linda Melvin motioned that we relocate our checking and savings accounts to US Bank in Encinitas, so that we can use the conference room at the bank for board meetings at no charge starting in January 2015. It was agreed that Cheryl Ehlers would not need to approve the move as she is no longer an officer or member of the board of directors of San Dieguito Art Guild, even though she is listed on the California nonprofit organization website as President from 2012. Devora Safran seconded the motion.

Motion passed: In Favor 13; Against 0; Abstain 0.

An informal vote was taken for the dates of the next three board meetings to be held on October 27, November 17, and December 22, 2014 at the current location.

President's Items:

- 1) The **conflict of interest forms** were passed out and signed by board members. Susan Schulte will file them at the Off Track Gallery.
- 2) Rita Holweiler-Cecil was introduced as the **new Jobs Chair**.

 Motion: Grace Swanson motioned for Rita Holweiler-Cecil as Jobs Chair. Jill Treadwell Svendson seconded. Motion passed: In Favor 13; Against 0; Abstain 0
 3) A new 5 year lease for the Off Track Gallery has been prepared by Donna Nelson and sent to Carol Korfin. We will sign the lease and send a financial statement with it back. Carol noted that SDAG is supposed to spend 2% of gross income on advertising or the management can bill us for that amount.
- 4) Laura Lowenstein was introduced as the **Cultural Tourism representative of Encinitas**. The upcoming Dia de Los Muertos Celebration is at the library on Saturday, November 1st from 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Laura is requesting that SDAG support this event by donating \$250 to sponsor one of the workshops.

Motion: Grace Swanson motioned that SDAG donate \$250 to cultural event at the Encinitas Library on November 1st for educational community need. Terry Oshrin seconded. Motion passed: In Favor 13; Against 0; Abstain 0.

Old Business:

- 1) **SDAG 2015 Calendar-Grace Swanson** brought in finished rough draft for informal proofreading by the board. The logo contest was won by Grace (the only one to submit a logo) and received \$25 gift certificate to the gallery. Laura Lowenstein will also proofread the calendar.
- 2) **Lighting-Pam Taylor Waldman** discussed the approved lighting for the gallery. The first of three installments will cost \$808.34 to be done immediately.

Website upgrade: Pam researched (along with Jill Treadwell Svendsen) the top 10 scheduling websites and recommends Calendar Whiz. The website is similar to the gallery's existing website and costs about \$25/month, \$247/year. We will get a 30 day free trial. The present website is not working for our needs and needs to be updated, plus the company is out of business.

Motion: Pam T. Waldman motioned for the gallery to purchase new scheduling software for the Off Track Gallery. Devora Safran seconded. Motion passed: In Favor 13; Against 0; Abstain 0.

3) **Soravia Paintings-Grace Swanson** said a chairperson still needs to be assigned. There will be a later discussion on this topic.

Committee Chair Reports

Membership-Karen Fidel said over \$10,000 came in for membership, since it is due this month for new and renewing membership.

Gallery Chairs - Linda Melvin/Terry Oshrin and Pamela Waldman discussed the upgrade of the card racks, which includes puchasing one new card rack, refurbish two card racks, repainting of the doors for the card racks, and new name tags for artists. The board decided that the jewelry category is now closed. Steve Lutzger volunteered to call artists for the bazaar. A discussion was held about the silent auction at the bazaar.

Monthly Show Chair - Lynn Ely led a discussion about the upcoming "Small Images" show on November 18th from 3:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. The board agreed with Lynn that there needs to be an incentive for entering artists.

Jobs Chair - Rita Hohweiler-Cecil led a discussion on monthly show jobs. The board members agreed that there needs to be a consequence for a member not fulfilling monthly show job. No decisions were made, but will continue discussion next month. Also discussed if a monthly show member, who is also is a wall/floor renter, should be responsible for an additional job.

Hospitality Chair-Devora Safran discussed that the 1st Thursday receptions at the gallery need a budget for food/drink costs. Also, she suggested a banner for the artist receptions. The next reception is a holiday event on December 7th from 3:30 to 6:00

The meeting was called to order by Carol Korfin at 10:00am.

Regarding the minutes of the last meeting, Pam Waldman had a correction: Cards (not card racks) will be rotated on a regular basis.

Motion: Lynn made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected. Grace seconded. Unanimously approved.

Treasurers Report - Linda Melemed

The September 2014 Financial Statements were distributed by email to the board prior to the meeting. The net profit for the month was \$9,310. There were no questions or comments, and the Financial Statements were approved by all.

The Tax Return for the Financial Year End August 2014 has been filed and the new CPA firm AKT, LLC saved the Guild over \$300.

The bank accounts at USBank are all set up and ready to be used starting in December. The credit card machine linking us to the new account was installed and will be saving us \$50 per month on merchant fees.

Motion: Karen Fidel motioned and Linda Melvin seconded to approve the financial report and use of Elavon credit card processing, saving the gallery \$500/year for this service. The motion was approved by the board.

Motion: Karen Fidel motioned for purchase of the Apple Pay machine for \$230/year. It was seconded by Pam Waldman and approved by all present.

Chair Reports

<u>Grace Swanson, PR Chair</u>: Grace talked about the upcoming Silent Auction at the Holiday Bazaar on November 15. She reminded gallery vendors and members to bring in donated items before November 7th. Also, for all members

postcards for advertising the bazaar ready at the gallery and for members to give out to local businesses. Also, Facebook ads had been placed.

<u>Pam Waldman, Calendar Chair</u>: Pam reported that she has the new calendar ready for February/March. For members that have limited scope of time for job assignments, they will have a chance to sign up for jobs first before members who have a more flexible time frame.

Pam also requested \$5,000 for the new website that Kathleen Magee is designing for the gallery.

Motion: The request for \$2,500 start-up monies for new website was motioned by Grace Swanson and Lin Holzinger seconded. The motion was approved.

<u>Linda Melvin, Gallery Manager and Committee Chair:</u> Linda presented the minutes of the committee meeting from October 24th.

The next jury session is on November 14th at Linda's home. Linda is training Caroline Van Leeuwen to take over running the jurying and having future sessions at Carolina's home. Cheryl Ehlers will be contacted for insurance purposes.

An item of putting book cases in a space in the gallery was discussed. The committee felt that this would not work out at this time. A suggestion of having a book/bead exchange at a special meeting, where all members could attend, might be possible in the next couple of months.

The issue of the jewelry tags needing more information on metals used was discussed. The metal used in a piece of jewelry needs to be clearly written on the tag and/or on a small sign in the vendor's space. The floor chairs will have to address this problem in upcoming months.

The card rack installation will be on November 6th and 7th and Barb Mille will monitor the people using the racks. The committee will be in charge of the space rotation.

The Photography medium that has been enhanced with paint or embedded photography in a medium will now be called Photographic Mixed Media.

Karen Fidel suggested a welcoming committee be formed for contacting new members to invite them to the annual meeting in January and to suggest that they help with the monthly show people. Rita Hohweiler-Cecil, the Jobs Coordinator, should be contacted to seek out people for this committee.

<u>Julie Bubar, Programs Chair:</u> Julie discussed the upcoming demos at the Encinitas Branch Library that are free and open to the public on several Sundays of the month from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm.

The Richard Hawk demo was discussed including the issue of attendance. 95 people RSVP'd the demo on October 12th, but only 60 attended the event. Julie said that emails were sent out in advance for RSVP's, but that the RSVP'ers were not notified again. People should be notified again closer to the date of the event. Carol suggested that a list of RSVP'ers be added to constant contact list for future events. Grace Swanson offered to add them.

Old Business

Carol said that the lease of the gallery still needs to be signed by the landlord and sent back to her.

The new 2015 calendars are done and in the gallery for sale at \$15 each. Grace said to write in the description space of sales log as "2015 SDAG Calendar".



Rules for Monthly Show

INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

- 1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.
- 2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES
- 3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.
- 4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.
- 5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- 2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17
- 3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22







INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE....

- 1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.
- 2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES
- 3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.
- 4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.
- 5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- 2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17
- 3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22







INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE....

- 1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.
- 2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES
- 3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.
- 4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.
- 5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- 2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17
- 3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22

Artist's Biography



In his seventh year as a watercolorist, Chuck's efforts have garnered hundreds of awards for his artwork and double Signature status with The San Diego Watercolor Society and National Watercolor Society.

He served two years as the Member Shows Director on the SDWS Board, and as Third VP on the NWS Board, plus a concurrent three-year stint as Newsletter Chair on the Board of Directors for the San Diego Museum of Art Artists Guild.

Chuck paints full-time and builds his reputation through a quick wit and his 6" brush, flamboyantly embellishing paintings with props borrowed from large and intimate crowds... like lipstick & coffee. He co-founded BallastPointGallery.com and serves as a discerning art show juror and critique specialist.

January Monthly Show Judge - John Modesitt

John Modesitt (b. 1955) was born in Los Alamos, New Mexico on November 6, 1955, but he spent most of his early years in southern California. He started painting at the age of thirteen.

My father's poster collection of French Impressionist Paintings were my initial inspiration to paint and draw. Monet was my favorite, I knew even then that painting would be my life's work. Modesitt attended a number a of institutions of higher learning in California, including Santa Barbara City College, the Santa



Barbara Art Museum and Cabrillo City College in Santa Cruz.

Modesitt moved to New York City in 1980 to study art more seriously. He was engaged in formal study at the Metropolitan Museum of Art from 1981 until 1984. For the most part he was discouraged by the domination of modern art in the galleries and with the instruction given which was a non-disciplined approach to painting. Modesitt decided to advance his techniques and aesthetic by studying the works of the master painters which lined the walls of the Metropolitan.

Modesitt moved to Midwest for a brief period of enrollment at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in the fall of 1985. He had previously traveled widely in the area sketching and painting. As in New York Modesitt again spent his time studying the collection of the Art Institute, especially the renowned paintings of such French masters as Manet, Monet, Pissarro and Renoir. In addition to painting outdoors on the Fox River, he also found time to offer a class in plein air painting.

Modesitt returned to California in the early 1990's and established a home and studio in Solana Beach. Here he began to paint en plein air the many facets of the California vista: coastals, the Sierra Nevada Mountains, desert scenes and the San Diego foothills alive with meadows of blooming flowers. In 1999 Modesitt and his family established a summer residence in the small village of Griselles in the Burgundy countryside. It is a place of tranquility with no more than twenty inhabitants which has inspired the artist to produce a portfolio of distinguished paintings.

John Modesitt emerged from a new wave of California Impressionists who paint in the style of Payne, Rose and Braun. Like these early masters Modesitt paints what he feels about nature and translates his emotional and spiritual experiences into rhythmic color compositions on canvas.

Artist: "I will start teaching oil painting again beginning this month. The classes are in my home sudio. Usually private or a group of 2-3. Cost is \$40 hour per person. If anyone is interested, please let me know. It will have an emphasis on impressionism. I enjoy teaching and stopped for 20 years. I used to teach at the Museum of Art San Diego and also community college as well as plein air classes. This will be a studio setting."
