SDAG January Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Carol Korfin at 10:06 a.m. in a conference room at the new meeting location of the US Bank in Encinitas. Carol Korfin welcomed everyone at the meeting to the new location and a positive message for 2015.

Cheryl Ehlers, of Stardust Arts was awarded a \$500 grant, and T.E.R.I. was awarded a \$1,200 grant for their program at the December 8th reception. Thank you's to SDAG from both agencies were read by Carol. Raffle prize amounts at future receptions were discussed by the board.

Motion: Lin Holzinger motioned for the amount of \$25 for raffle prizes at 2015 gallery receptions. Karen Fidel seconded the motion. The board was approved by the board.

Motion: The minutes for the last meeting were pre-approved via e-mail and before the meeting got started by all the board members. Karen Fidel motioned for the minutes to be approved and Linda Melemed seconded the motion. Approved: 13, Denied: 0, Abstain: 1

Treasurer's Report -Linda Melemed

Linda was reporting on the trend of the previous years and that the gallery needs to have more money making events throughout the year to increase funds. The board discussed various ways for the gallery to raise more money.

Devora Safran suggested that SDAG offer discounted membership to college age students. They could enter the monthly shows and help out with gallery sitting, volunteer at events, and act as docents at the Mother's Day Show. The idea of a membership drive at the Mother's Day Show was further discussed.

Laura Lowenstein suggested that SDAG could offer sponsorship similar to other local agencies, such as, Encinitas Friends of the Arts, at different levels of support as membership. Carol Korfin, Grace Swanson, and Laura will be meeting with the president of EFA, Naimeh Tanha Woodward on Wednesday and report back to the board.

Motion: Carol Korfin made the motion for the docents at the Mother's Day Show handle the membership sign-ups and suggested a meeting the membership committee. Karen Fidel seconded the motion. The board approved the motion.

Chair Reports

<u>PR Chair - Grace Swanson:</u> Grace talked about the upcoming gallery receptions for 2015: May 3rd and August 9th from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. Devora Safran proposed that the May reception be changed to June 14th because of reception in May being too close to the Mother's Day Show. Also, the August 9th reception is being changed to August 30th at the same time. The December 6th reception will be discussed at a later date. Grace said that Tracy Patrucci can teach a class on electronic ads and social media for \$115 hour to several students from the gallery if interested.

The BWLH classed are all full except for Linda Melvin's class and Barbara Roth's second class.

<u>Mother's Day Show - Laura Lowenstein:</u> Laura reported that 38 artists applied for the upcoming show in May which is more people than last year. There are 11 jewelers, 8 floor artists, 13 painters, and 2 photographers. There were two sign-up days, one was held after the annual SDAG meeting in January. The artist application fee total was \$2,775.00 which will deposited in mid February.

<u>Calendar/Lighting/Card Racks - Pam Waldman:</u> Pam said that the new instructions for Elavon were sent out to all the gallery members. There is a Quick Reference Guide in the staffing binder at the gallery desk. Karla Nederlof can remind the morning and evening gallery staffers to review the Elavon instructions on the desk near the device. Grace suggested that people sign-up for phone contacts to remind the gallery sitters to read the Elavon instructions at the beginning of their shift.

Pam placed the second order of light bulbs which are less expensive than the first order. There was a delay in manufacturing of the blue bulbs.

Pam reported that Sandy Heath was handling early calendar sign-ups before the Tuesday monthly show.

The card racks rotation is horizontal.

<u>Gallery Committee - Linda Melvin: (Absent)</u> There was no gallery committee meeting in December.

<u>Programs - Julie Bubar</u>: Julie reported that the Gamblin Oils presentation at the Encinitas Library was excellent and that 85 people attended with a RSVP of 109 people. The raffle generated \$73 and printing cost was \$5.

The next workshop with Angela Jackson at the Encinitas Library is now closed, but the next two workshops are still open.

Julie announced that Artist and Craftsman Supply in Hillcrest if offering 10% off for all artists at the gallery.

Many members of the board agreed that a membership drive could take place at the Demos, Dialogues & Art classes.

<u>Monthly Show Chair - Lynn Ely:</u> Lynn shared Jeffrey Sitcov's article about his charity, Photocharity. Also, there are painting classes at the Episcople Church in Ocean Beach from 4:00 - 6:00 p.m.

Old Business

Carol Korfin talked about a business asking for money from SDAG, because we used a photo from a well publicized site without their permission. Carol is questioning the validity of the claim, since our group took a photo from a public site. Further discussion resulted in a future letter that will be sent to this business asking for more proof.

The board decided to drop the Vino and Van Gogh Event idea and work on further money making events for the gallery.

The idea of having an art event in the patio outside the gallery was formulated. Like C Note at the San Diego Art Institute, have the members display art to sell at a special reception with artwork sold for \$50 and \$100. Another idea is for artists pay for their booths in the patio and sell their artwork. Grace Swanson will talk to Rick Moore at DEMA to see if SDAG needs a special permit to do this in the patio outside St. Tropez and if they could do the catering for the event. Possible date of the reception: August 30th.

<u>50th Anniversary Chair - Lin Holzinger:</u> The camp retreat site for Camp Cedar Glen in Julian will be decided soon by the committee. The advantages of the site is that it has a pool and archery for activities, three cabins with each having a living room and double bathrooms, a chapel, an activity room, and a kitchen for special meal preparation. Our group will get one third of the dining hall to be shared with two other groups. There are no handicap facilities available. The committee of 6 people will send out a survey to ask about interest from the members in this event, an e-blast from Paint Rag.

There was no new business discussions.

Motion: Linda Melemed motioned for the adjournment of the meeting with Lin Holzinger seconding the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 12:27 p.m. The motion was passed by the board.

She reminded everyone of the theme of the guild: **HOPE:** help accomplish the goals by volunteering, open up to new ideas, positive attitude at all times, and engage more members.

Old Business

Finances: (from Linda Melemed, Treasurer)

2014 Income (approximate):

- 1) Membership from almost 200 members
- 2) Gallery Operations; floor rental and wall space: \$31,000
- 3) 15% commissions on sales: \$15,000: Wall 32%, Floor 20%, Jewelry 48%

1) The guild renewed the lease for 5 years at the same terms. Rent: \$44,000/year at this time

- 501C3 Giving: Scholarships- four Mira Costa students @\$500/each; TERI \$1,200; Stardust Arts - Cheryl Ehlers \$500; and Photocharity -Jeffrey Sitcov \$500.
- 4) Programs: Julie Bubar for Demos and Dialogues with City of Encinitas at Encinitas Library; Grace Swanson for Because We Like Hue classes

Carol Korfin introduced the SDAG board of directors and Committee Chairs. She thanked all of them, and other members of committees and members of ongoing jobs that she recognized. Carol gave condolences to Jon Lovegren, whose wife, Betty, recently passed away.

New Business

Laura Lowenstein, the Mother's Day Chair, talked about the plans for the upcoming show in May, a few houses that have been selected to be in the show, and introduced Joyce Nash as the docent chair. Joyce did talk for a few minutes about the docent program for the show. Laura said that sign-ups for artist and docent participation will be after the meeting and at a later second sign-up date.

Lin Holzinger the Soravia artwork coordinator, talked about the artist, Roy Robert Soravia and his life, and the special offer to members. SDAG members could purchase an original artwork for \$100 each or \$175 for two painting at the meeting.

Carol talked about a new tradition that SDAG will incorporate each year. A "Member of the Year" will be picked by members each year. This year the board members unanimously chose Grace Swanson as the first honoree. Grace was given a gift for her service. Carol also told the attendees that Grace's design for the 50th anniversary logo was the only submission, was lovely, and will be used all year long.

Lin Holzinger talked about other 50th anniversary future events that are in the planning stages for this year. She needs chairs and committee members to brainstorm, plan, and run these events.

 Half C note: a wine and hors douevres evening to be held in the patio outside of the Off Track Gallery. Lin suggested to sell paintings @ \$50/\$100.

Grace Swanson held the raffle drawings for members: 10 names were chosen and were given two 50th anniversary calendars each. One was chosen and won a Soravia of their choice.

Carol called on members to stand, when she requested, to be recognized for the amount of time that members have been involved in SDAG. Quite a few have been members for over 10 years, and quite a few new members were in attendance. Close to 70 attended the event in all.

Carol ended the meeting at 12:35 p.m. on a high note with thanking everyone for attending and reminding members for sign-ups, purchases of Soravia paintings and art supplies, or engaging in the bead swap. Wes Farmer took a group photo at the end of the meeting.

Wendy's Reflection on the Project

Through my creative process I seek to show the essence, the soul and the hopefulness in the faces of each woman I paint, capturing their spirit while actively involved in their daily tasks.

I want to encourage and nurture the empowering spirit of hope women share globally and bring awareness to the importance of each woman and her relevance in her home, town, country and the world. Through the collective female energy, we can create a larger consciousness, and promote change in the face of unjust acts against women worldwide during a dramatic period of transition for women in human history.



The Relevant Women Project began very organically in 2010. After the first painting of 'Marisol', the fruit seller from Colombia, I scoured my photos from past travels in Ecuador, Peru, and other images from Colombia and I discovered that I loved to take photos of women. My creative julces were flowing, and soon I had 8 completed paintings. Four women who live locally took shape on my canvas with my Mother, Sandy, completing the series of 12 Women, 12 Paintings, 12 Months. The circle of women continues to grow each year with new portraits of other Relevant Women.

I am a painter, not a writer, yet I needed to understand why the paintings were affecting me so deeply. Lois Sunrich, a Encinitan and founder of Story Arts, (and a surprise recipient of a portrait) suggested I write about each painting in our journaling group, and if I didn't know the woman, give her a name. This lead to the portrait descriptions that accompany each piece. The project is now available in book form in two sizes.

'Gram' from San Diego was my first commissioned painting for this series. As she viewed her portrait, Gram quietly said, "She is so beautiful...! am not that beautiful." Her daughter spoke up with a tear in her eye, "Mom, this is how we see you." In that moment, I realized that this project is about all of us recognizing our own inner beauty and relevance in life.

January Monthly Show Judge - Karen Langer Baker



Karen Langer Baker received her first scholarship to the Chicago Art Institute at age eight and later earned her Bachelor's Degree in art and education from the University of Michigan in 1958. In the 1960s, as she worked toward a Master's Degree in Special Education at California State University in Fullerton, she developed the concept of individualized instruction in the classroom and, using this method, taught all subjects at Eldorado School for Gifted Children in Orange and in the Yorba Linda Elementary School District's new program for learning disabled

children. Art was extensively used as a way to nurture each child's innate abilities.

In the '70s and '80s, Karen was a Certified Prepared Childbirth teacher and labor coach and, since then, she has continued to further her interests in the health arena along with her involvement in the visual arts field, having earned several credentials in energy healing facilitation, including clinical hypnotherapy, applied kinesiology and Chinese energy medicine.

In 1986, she went back to concentrating on her first love--art--and enrolled as a full-time student at Otis Art Institute in Los Angeles, where she received two years of formal training in traditional painting, sculpture and drawing techniques. She still attends many classes and workshops by national and international award-winning artists.

San Dieguito Art Guild - 50 Years

San Dieguito Art Guild -- Surviving and Thriving by Grace Swanson

This year the San Dieguito Art Guild celebrates it's 50th anniversary. The Guild was started in 1965 in Del Mar by **Sue Beere** who called 12 of her fellow artists together for coffee on her back patio. They formed the first members of the Guild. **Vilma Malmberg**, who is still a member of the Guild, was one of those original 12.

They first had a small gallery (The Blue Lantern) on the main street of Del Mar, then moved to former Saint James Catholic Church, which is today the Del Mar Library. Next they moved to a 3-story building which is today behind a huge hedge behind the L'Auberge Hotel in Del Mar.

In 1975 the Guild moved to Leucadia mostly because one of the members had property for rent along highway 101. The Guild was behind the Corner Frame Shop (which is still there today) for a very long time.

In June of 1982 a group of 10 artists founded the Offtrack Gallery downstairs in the Pannikin Coffee Shop. They soon found that running that gallery was too much for them. A couple of those members also belonged to SDAG. One of them was **Patricia Watkins** who convinced the SDAG Board to merge. The San Dieguito Art Guild became the legal and financial organization which ran the Offtrack Gallery. Again they were there for a very long time.



Eventually, the Pannikin wanted that downstairs space for themselves and did not renew the Guild's lease. The Guild moved the Offtrack Gallery to a store-front location on the corner of Highway 101 and Leucadia Blvd. Losing the space at the Pannikin and the advancing age of many of the "movers and shakers" of the Guild almost did the Guild in. When Laura Lowenstein was President and I was Gallery Manager, we had to shut down the Offtrack Gallery and try to keep the Guild going without a physical location. One more month of keeping the Gallery doors open would mean the Guild would be completely out of money. We had a garage sale and sold almost everything -- all the fixtures, the card racks, the desk etc. What we did not sell we stored in a shed that we assembled on the property of Kirk Van Allen. That shed, by the way, is still there with some left-over stuff that no one has looked at in 10 years! Membership dwindled to well under 100 members -- many of whom by this time were not active.

For 4 months the Guild had no gallery and the Board was discouraged. Then **Jim Gilliam**, Encinitas City Arts Commissioner, called the Guild with news of a temporary building available to artists -for \$1 a square foot. The proposal to rent 700 sqare feet of this temporary building was voted down by the Board. **Joanne Chambers** (Treasurer) and I told the Board that this was such a great deal that we would open a gallery ourselves and run it as a for-profit gallery. Well, said **Laura Lowenstein**, that was just the right thing to say. She got enough of the Board to vote yes on the move. **Barb Mille'** and I began the task of scrubbing and painting a very neglected, soonto-be-demolished building. We thought we had the building for maybe 4 months -- as permits for the demolition were going through the City of Encinitas' system. We did not even try to have Wall Renters and Floor Renters because we though we would be ousted at any time. Everyone had to be Monthly Renters only -- one month at a time. We ended up being there for almost 2 years from 2006 to June of 2008. The permits took a lot longer than anyone had thought.



The search was on AGAIN for gallery space. We looked at about 100 different buildings and spaces, driving in caravans day after day following up on leads and ads. Finally we found the best space possible on the corner of Second and D Streets -- one block (unfortunately) off the main street of downtown Encinitas. Our rent went from \$700 a month to \$3,000. I lay awake all night after signing that lease convinced we had just made a huge mistake. Well, we had not. In spite of the less then ideal location, the Guild membership grew and our bank account got healthier.

In June of 2009, the Guild opened a second (to be temporary) gallery at our present location. That meant 2 sets of staffing calendars, 2 sets of books for the Treasurer, 2 Gallery Manangers, 2 Wall Chairs, 2 Floor Chairs etc. Running 2 galleries about did us in. Everyone was overworked and tempers ran short. It was actually a relief when the building on Second Street was sold and we were booted out. At that point we decided we needed a permanent home for the Gallery. It has been one of the best decisions that the Board has made.

Membership is up, we have a strong Board of Directors and we are THRIVING.

5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

February Monthly Show Judge - John Modesitt



John Modesitt (b. 1955) was born in Los Alamos, New Mexico on November 6, 1955, but he spent most of his early years in southern California. He started painting at the age of thirteen.

My father's poster collection of French Impressionist Paintings were my initial inspiration to paint and draw. Monet was my favorite, I knew even then that painting would be my life's work. Modesitt attended a number a

of institutions of higher learning in California, including Santa Barbara City College, the Santa Barbara Art Museum and Cabrillo City College in Santa Cruz.

Modesitt moved to New York City in 1980 to study art more seriously. He was engaged in formal study at the Metropolitan Museum of Art from 1981 until 1984. For the most part he was discouraged by the domination of modern art in the galleries and with the instruction given which was a non-disciplined approach to painting. Modesitt decided to advance his techniques and aesthetic by studying the works of the master painters which lined the walls of the Metropolitan.

Modesitt moved to Midwest for a brief period of enrollment at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in the fall of 1985. He had previously traveled widely in the area sketching and painting. As in New York Modesitt again spent his time studying the collection of the Art Institute, especially the renowned paintings of such French masters as Manet, Monet, Pissarro and Renoir. In addition to painting outdoors on the Fox River, he also found time to offer a class in plein air painting.

Modesitt returned to California in the early 1990's and established a home and studio in Solana Beach. Here he began to paint en plein air the many facets of the California vista: coastals, the Sierra Nevada Mountains, desert scenes and the San Diego foothills alive with meadows of blooming flowers. In 1999 Modesitt and his family established a summer residence in the small village of Griselles in the Burgundy countryside. It is a place of tranquility with no more than twenty inhabitants which has inspired the artist to produce a portfolio of distinguished paintings.

John Modesitt emerged from a new wave of California Impressionists who paint in the style of Payne, Rose and Braun. Like these early masters Modesitt paints what he feels about nature and translates his emotional and spiritual experiences into rhythmic color compositions on canvas.

Artist: "I will start teaching oil painting again beginning this month. The classes are in my home studio. Usually private or a group of 2-3. Cost is \$40 hour per person. If anyone is interested, please let me know. It will have an emphasis on impressionism. I enjoy teaching and stopped for 20 years. I used to teach at the Museum of Art San Diego and also community college as well as plein air classes. This will be a studio setting."

Motion: Karen Fidel made a motion to pass the February minutes with Linda Melvin seconding the motion. Approved: 11, Opposed: 0, Abstain: 2.

Treasurer's Report: Linda Melemed

Motion: Karen Fidel made a motion to approve the treasurer's report as stands with Grace Swanson seconding the motion. The board approved the financials.

<u>Calendar Chair - Pam Waldman:</u> Pam needs more people working at the gallery before and during the Mother's Day Show.

<u>PR Chair - Grace Swanson:</u> Grace announced another training session for Facebook Ad training for today from 10:30 to 12:30 in Mission Valley and needs one person from the guild to attend.

Motion: Grace Swanson made a motion for the guild to pick up half the cost of the Facebook Ad Class (\$230) and the members pay the other half who attend the class. All the board approved the motion.

<u>Hospitality Chair: Devora Safran:</u> Devora cannot cover the next reception at the gallery due to her work schedule. Linda Melvin offered to take over the reception which will be held on Saturday, April 18th from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. The theme will be barbecue with three featured artists. Linda said that featured artists need to apply and pay \$50. Dolores Renner said she would like to be one of them. There will be a drawing for two tickets for the Mother's Day Show and a 10% discount on gallery merchandise that evening.

Carol Korfin said that Thora Guthrie from the Encinitas 101 Downtown Association announced the First Thursday which will start on April 2nd from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Our gallery will give out free greeting cards for visitors on first Thursdays.

<u>Programs Chair - Julie Bubar:</u> The Robin Johnson Demo on March 15th at the Encinitas Library was a big success with 32 in attendance and 44 RSVP's. The raffle made \$120 and Gamblin Oils gave Robin 14 tubes of oil paints. The next Demo at the library is April 19th with Kevin Greeland. Thirty people have RSVP'd so far. There are open sign-ups for May 17th and June 21st Demos. Julie gave out Mother's Day bookmarks at the demos to promote the event.

<u>Web Mistress - Jill Treadwell Svendsen:</u> Jill said that she needed suggestions for the new website and the board discussed several ideas. There are two approved gallery logos that were approved previously by the board that should be used in association with the guild. <u>Jobs Chair - Rita Hohweiler-Cecil:</u> (Absent) Rita sent an email letter to members to access job availability on website.

<u>Calendar Chair - Pam Waldman:</u> The new staffing calendars were made up and sent out to members for June and July. July 4th will be open only from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. with only one staffer needed.

Lin Holzinger - 50th Reunion Chair: (Lin Absent) Carol Korfin reported for Lin. Lin and her committee looked at the Highland Springs Resort in Beaumont, CA for a possibility for the fall retreat. Possible dates are October 30 - November 2 weekend. There are two types of rooms: a double and a triple both with bathrooms. The cost would be

around \$260 for the weekend. An extra \$20 is needed for projects. Further discussion is needed to make a decision about the dates for the event.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE....

1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.

2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES

3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.

4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.

5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- 2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17
- 3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22

Julie serves as Assistant Director of Front Porch Gallery, a nonprofit gallery in Carlsbad where she is in her 10th year. She juries exhibits for the gallery and other venues and curates exhibitions from painting and photography, to sculpture, fiber and book arts to glass, etc. Additionally, she works with other nonprofits and with gallery artists as well as handling day to day operations. April Monthly Show Judge - Richard Hawk

Richard Hawk is an internationally collected artist living and working in San Diego, California. A figurative painter on canvas and paper, he also works in special oxidation techniques on copper.

ARTIST'S STATEMENT

My work at this time makes extensive use of the oxidation of copper to create the underlying composition on which to paint. Copper is capable of extraordinary color, textural variation, and naturalistic character when oxidized - that is, exposed to certain natural acidic catalysts.



These oxidation effects are difficult to control and master. In fact, mastering the materials fully in the usual sense is impossible. Striving to do so, however, results in a co creative visual poetry that keeps me coming back for more.

In observing, exploring, and trying to understand life and art, I have come to realize that I am attracted to the uncontrollable. More specifically, I am drawn to that difficult sector where the controlled and the uncontrollable meet. Exciting things happen there.

When it comes to the painting part of these works, rapid alla prima painting, which forces reliance on internalized knowledge and instinct rather than cognitive processes, perpetuates the unbridled character of the work.

Paradoxically, planning and design and specific intentions for the end result of the work are very much in play. Efforts at control are tempered with great respect for - even pursuit of - the accidental.

Ideally in every creative work, a balance is struck between the intention of artistic control and the previously unimagined results of magnificent forces beyond those of the artist. This is co creation at its best.
