#### Fun With Glass

Dates of class: Saturdays - January 4, 11, 18, 25 Time: 9am to noon Instructor: Kate O'Brien Location: Senior/Community Center in Encinitas

In this four (4) part class participants will be introduced to the art of working with stained glass. We will create a stained glass panel that will be framed in metal or wood and we will fuse glass to make a dish or a standing work of art that will sit in a metal frame. Students will learn to transfer a pattern to glass, cut and foil glass, solder the glass pieces together, the fundamentals of fusing and glass kiln firing schedules.

Written instructions will be provided to each participant to take home. Patterns will be available or the participants may create their own designs. All tools needed will be provided during the class time. A \$25 materials fee, which includes two firing fees, will be paid to the instructor at the first class.

Artist Statement

My paintings are allegories of self-awareness. They acknowledge the universal realities of life, love, and loss. Blending elements of nostalgia and contemporary experience, I create non-linear narratives embedded with symbolism and metaphor.

My focus as an artist is rooted in perception and experience, while engaging elements of fantasy and mystery. Specifically selecting familiar and memorable objects and environments, I paint the things that I know and feel, continually pulling from past experiences to create new images. My process includes staging, photographing, and collaging plausible but highly unlikely situations in which the content shifts between contemporary portraiture and narration. I find inspiration in personal ritual, ceremony, and identity, and am significantly influenced by the natural and cultural milieu of Southern California.

#### Renting Wall and Floor at the Off Track Gallery

Renting a full or half space at Off Track Gallery allows you to display your works of art near each other, thus attracting attention and facilitating understanding of your art. Renting can save you money, compared with entering the monthly show, if you exhibit a fairly large quantity of artwork.

To be a renter, you need to be accepted by SDAG's art jury, have entered three monthly shows in the medium you wish to display, staff the gallery once a month and do some additional work for the Guild. To rent, you must sign a contract saying that you agree to rent for at least four months and make a \$45 deposit refundable when you give a 60-day notice of leaving. #### INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE....

1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.

2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES

3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.

4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.

5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- 2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17
- 3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22

#### January Monthly Show Judge - Igor Koutsenko



Igor Koutsenko was born in Evpatoria, a resort city on the Crimean Peninsula on the Black Sea. His father brought Igor to the Children's Art School in his hometown after his son demonstrated artistic ability at a young age. At age eleven, Koutsenko was accepted to the adult art studio directed by the acclaimed artist Zvyagintesev who encouraged his talent. Later Igor was educated at the Penza School of Art (class of E. Iodynis) and received rigorous training in the old traditions of Russian realist art. While living in Moscow, he successfully used the Moscow art market to

sell his works to Russian and foreign collectors. His experience in Moscow allowed him to fully realize himself as an independent artist.

Koutsenko immigrated to the United States in 1992 settling in Oklahoma City where he taught fine art at the University of Central Oklahoma. In 1995, he was granted permanent United States residentship as an alien of extraordinary abilities. In 1998 Koutsenko visited Southern California and was attracted by its beautiful scenery and climate that reminded him of his boyhood surroundings in Crimea. Since moving to Southern California, he continues to produce original work at his private studio in Fallbrook. Igor also teaches drawing and painting classes at the Fallbrook School of The Arts.

#### From The Artist:

I have been in America for over eighteen years. All these years I have been looking for my place here as an immigrant and as an artist. Today I am much closer to finding that place. My influences are in Russian and European cultures. Recently I feel more of a connection with American culture. I am always thankful to those who encourage me with their interest in my work

#### February Monthly Show Judge - Cathy Carey

#### The Technique

I enjoy working in a series. I go to a place, take photos, paint on location, write thoughts and words about how the place "feels" to me. I am driven to enhance the color of the scene in order to express my emotional memories of the moment. I am drawn to images of fleeting moments, the patterns and textures of light, the illumination and shape of objects. Something about a scene I choose to paint is at once compelling to me and part of an everyday encounter.



My foremost interest in painting is the effective use of color in creating emotional and visual depth. When people look at my paintings, I think the first thing they notice is the vibrant color. I'm not even sure I see color in the same way as everyone else. Does everyone perceive the world in terms of the language of color? It's a wonderful paradox to ponder - what color do you "see", what color do I "see", what color is "real"?

#### The Philosophy

My personal philosophy of color is to express emotional meaning through color. I believe this is the purpose of art, to express the story of being alive at a particular time. Art is the physical manifestation of the emotional and spiritual nature of an artist's response to the world around them, and the world within them. Throughout the years I've worked in all media and I've researched and studied the many ways color is used to express emotion, perspective, and temperature. From my research I teach classes on Color Theory and wrote a workbook for my students called 'The Philosophy of Color', published in 2004.

"From Vine to Design," the gourd artwork of Encinitas artist Grace Swanson, is on view from Jan. 27 through Feb. 10 in the lobby of the Encinitas Library. The gourds on display are carved, burned, dyed, painted and embellished.

"My interest in gourds began as a small child, born and raised in Nigeria. The Nigerian people use gourds for everything from storing food to spoons to holding cosmetics. When I saw a class on gourd art offered by San Diego Botanic Garden, I decided to give it a try. The feel and smell of the burning gourd just took me 'home.' I was hooked," said Swanson.

She purchases her gourds from Welburn Gourd Farm just north of Fallbrook — uncleaned and uncut. First she soaks the gourds and scrubs away farm dirt and mold. Then she inspects each gourd carefully for flaws or cracks.

Each gourd has its own personality, and that often dictates what design she will burn into the gourd and whether it will stay whole or become a open vessel.

The mold that forms on the gourds makes patterns that can be used or disregarded, depending on the design. Sometimes, Swanson said, she has a very definite design in mind when she begins, and other times she makes it up as she goes along. Some gourds may take as little as two or three hours to complete. Others may take days or weeks.

The gourds are cut, Dremeled, sanded, dyed, carved, painted, beaded and finished with either gourd wax or an acrylic spray. The surface of a good-quality gourd is almost like wood, the difference being that it has an outer "skin" that is smooth. Dyes and paint can be wiped off. Beneath this skin is a softer flesh that absorbs dye and paint very readily and can create very interesting effects.

Gourds are grown in many shapes and sizes, ranging from tiny "jewelry" gourds to very large ones used as drums. Even though no two gourds are the exact shape and are never perfectly round or symmetrical, there are some basic shapes including apple, bottle, canteen, pear, snake and so on.

Throughout history, gourds have been utilitarian. They have been used as spoons, bowls, drums, and storage containers for water, wine, grain, etc. Some of Swanson's gourds may function as vessels and bowls. However, most of her designs are meant to be appreciated for their own sake.

Gourds can easily slip into the area of craft — painted to look like snowmen, Santas, and little animals — or made into lamps and birdhouses. This, however, does not

appeal to Swanson. She prefers to see how elegant, simple and sophisticated the lowly gourd can become.

"Gourds have taken over my life. My brushes, paints and canvas have been pushed to one side as I explore the wonderfully tactile, three-dimensional world of gourds."

## **Art Guild offers 'Fun With Glass' series**

The San Dieguito Art Guild offers "Fun with Glass" with Kate O'Brien, a four-part class starting in March.

Participants will be introduced to the art of glass fusing and slumping. Students will complete three projects of their choosing using System 96 glass.

The instructor will discuss the fundamentals of fusing and glass kiln firing schedules. Written instructions will be provided to each participant, and all tools needed will be provided during class time.

### Arts Alive 2014





### Renting Wall and Floor at the Off Track Gallery

Renting a full or half space at Off Track Gallery allows you to display your works of art near each other, thus attracting attention and facilitating understanding of your art. Renting can save you money, compared with entering the monthly show, if you exhibit a fairly large quantity of artwork.

To be a renter, you need to be accepted by SDAG's art jury, have entered three monthly shows in the medium you wish to display, staff the gallery once a month and do some additional work for the Guild. To rent, you must sign a contract saying that you agree to rent for at least four months and make a \$45 deposit refundable when you give a 60-day notice of leaving. More details can be found by clicking on "membership" on the top of Off Track Gallery's webpage.

The next art jury will be held on Friday, March 14, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. Please RSVP by contacting the Wall Chairperson Grace Swanson at <u>swanson121@cox.net</u> if you are interested in renting wall space. ### Rules for Monthly Show

1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.

2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES

3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.

4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.

5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

### Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- 2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17
- 3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22



### February Monthly Show Judge - Cathy Carey

I enjoy working in a series. I go to a place, take photos, paint on location, write thoughts and words about how the place "feels" to me. I am driven to enhance the color of the scene in order to express my emotional memories of the moment. I am drawn to images of fleeting moments, the patterns and textures of light, the illumination and shape of objects. Something about a scene I choose to paint is at once compelling to me and part of an everyday encounter.



My foremost interest in painting is the effective use of color in creating emotional and visual depth. When people look at my paintings, I think the first thing they notice is the vibrant color. I'm not even sure I see color in the same

way as everyone else. Does everyone perceive the world in terms of the language of color? It's a wonderful paradox to ponder - what color do you "see", what color do I "see", what color is "real"?

### The Philosophy

My personal philosophy of color is to express emotional meaning through color. I believe this is the purpose of art, to express the story of being alive at a particular time. Art is the physical manifestation of the emotional and spiritual nature of an artist's response to the world around them, and the world within them.

Throughout the years I've worked in all media and I've researched and studied the many ways color is used to express emotion, perspective, and temperature. From my research I teach classes on Color Theory and wrote a workbook for my students called 'The Philosophy of Color', published in 2004.

### Biography

I was born in San Diego and raised in Chula Vista. I attended Chula Vista High School: School for the Creative and Performing Arts (SCPA). I Graduated with honors and went on to receive a Fine Arts degree at The University of Southern California. After graduating I worked in Los Angeles in the special effects industry as a fabricator working on vehicle effects and prop building. In 2005 I began apprenticing under master muralists Mario Torero and Victor Ochoa. With them I learned about the rich history of the Chicano movement; Chicano Park, Centro Cultural de la Raza. There was an opportunity to volunteer my time at the

Centro Cultural de la Raza as Gallery Curator in 2009.

While working on exhibitions and community projects I have been able to work on diverse expressions of my own personal work. In 2007 I was also fortunate enough to earn a commission to paint relief sculpture of The Stations of the Cross at St. Patrick's Church in North Park. It was a collaboration with my brother Leo (an architect) who designed the altar and tabernacle. In 2009 I led a group of student artists to create large scale 13 feet tall Puppets for the Centro Cultural's first authentic Dia de los Muertos Procession. These pair of large scale puppets were built over a few months one male one female and now they have become an Iconic symbol of San Diego's only authentic Dia de los Muertos Procession, now in its sixth year.

Utilizing the tools and experience learned at the Jacobs Center, I have been able to apply a similar formula and volunteer my time as Gallery Curator at The Centro Cultural de la Raza. The Centro is the oldest longest running Chicano Arts & Cultural Centers in the United States. It has a rich history of quality art exhibits, dance groups, spoken word and film and theatre programs. Many cultural and activists groups have called Centro home over the last 44 years. One of our most recent collaborations with El Jefe productions was "The Loteria Show." This show took place on February 16th 2013 at Centro and was themed surrounding the mexican pastime of Loteria, a bingo type game played by many hispanic families.

Since August 2013 I am a full time Museum Educator at The San Diego Museum of Art. I travel to urban and rural areas of the city and bring the fine arts experience to underserved communities. I teach art workshops and lessons at community centers, alternative schools and juvenile detentions centers.

## INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE....

1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.

2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES

3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.

4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.

5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12

2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17

3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22



I was born in San Diego and raised in Chula Vista. I attended Chula Vista High School: School for the Creative and Performing Arts (SCPA). I Graduated with honors and went on to receive a Fine Arts degree at The University of Southern California. After graduating I worked in Los Angeles in the special effects industry as a fabricator working on vehicle effects and prop building. In 2005 I began apprenticing under master muralists Mario Torero and Victor Ochoa.

While working on exhibitions and community projects I have been able to work on diverse expressions of my own personal work. In 2007 I was also fortunate enough to earn a commission to paint relief sculpture of The Stations of the Cross at St. Patrick's Church in North Park. It was a collaboration with my brother Leo (an architect) who designed the altar and tabernacle. In 2009 I led a group of student artists to create large scale 13 feet tall Puppets for the Centro Cultural's first authentic Dia de los Muertos Procession. These pair of large scale puppets were built over a few months one male one female and now they have become an Iconic symbol of San Diego's only authentic Dia de los Muertos Procession, now in its sixth year.

In April 2012 I was afforded the opportunity to curate a group show including local artists from San Diego urban neighborhoods. This took place at the Center for Community & Cultural Arts at the Jacobs Center for Neighborhood Innovations. Since August 2013 I am a full time Museum Educator at The San Diego Museum of Art. I travel to urban and rural areas of the city and bring the fine arts experience to underserved communities. I teach art workshops and lessons at community centers, alternative schools and juvenile detentions centers. I also, when possible arrange visits to the Museum and we host students and teachers weekly, through our School in the Park program (SITP).

#### Andrea Arisiaga

Andrea Arisiaga has received her Certificate in Digital Photography and continues to study drawing and composition, oil painting, watercolor, acrylic painting, charcoal, and pastels. Not only has Andrea completed traditional art classes, she has a strong interest in Digital media such as digital photography and various programs such as Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Photoshop Light Room, Adobe Bridge, Camera Raw, & Adobe Illustrator.

Presently Andrea is still a student at MiraCosta College and is working with Gilbert Neri in Art 230, Introduction to Installation and Site Specific Art. Andrea's project in Professor Neri's class is a large installation project that tells a story about, La Lechusa, a Mexican folklore tale about a white owl, a witch that at night would fly around and steals infants from their families in the late hours of the night.

Installation as a form of art is new and challenging for Andrea, which she enjoys. Future educational goals are to complete all of the studio art and digital media courses before transferring to a four-year school to work on her B.A. and M.F.A.

#### Rules for Monthly Show

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE. . . .

1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.

2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES

3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.

4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.

5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12

2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17

3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22





#### Officers Absent: Karen Fidel

Call to order at 10:35 a.m. by Grace Swanson

#### Minutes of March Meeting – Gayle Baker

Motion: Grace Swanson motioned and Sandy Heath seconded to approve the March 24, 2014 Board Meeting Minutes. The Minutes were originally acknowledged and reviewed by the Board members via e-mail. Motion passed: In Favor 12; Against 0; Abstain 2.

#### Treasurer's Report – Linda Melemed

The financials were distributed to the board via email in advance of the meeting. Sandy Health questioned why our annual income was down. Linda responded that she thought the promotional discount the gallery offers on reception day was the culprit. Discussion ensued on the topic and ways to balance out the loss. The board agreed to revisit the issue after a year.

Linda also noted that she had called the BOE, and was informed that renters in the gallery do not need a resale license.

# Motion: Grace Swanson made a motion to approve the March 31, 2014 financials submitted by Linda Melemed and Sandy Heath seconded. Motion passed: In Favor 14; Against 0; Abstain 0.

#### Calendar Report – Pamela Waldman

Pam reported that Terry Allen had not had any success contacting Pandora for music service in the gallery. Grace indicated she would give it a try.

Pam also noted the issue of empty staffing slots on the May Calendar. She said the reduction of renters and more summer shifts had caused the problem. Pam had worked out a new schedule for the extra shifts. Sandy Heath noted the slots could be filled with renter in need of jobs.

#### Jobs Chair Report- Sandy Health

Sandy reported that she continues to have problems with select members. The board reinforced that she has authority to remove work from the gallery following a final warning letter.

#### Gallery Manager Report - Linda Melvin

Linda reported that there continues to be thefts in the gallery. A necklace, matching bracelet and a small painting have been reported missing. Linda plans to install some larger signs indicating that patrons are being video recorded.

Linda also plans to reduce the number of jewelry artists through natural attrition. Much discussion ensued. Linda noted that the little Italy show went well and Kathy Chin no longer wants to be the off-site coordinator for the event. But she might share the responsibility.

 Lin reported that the Mother's day publicity was in full swing. Ads will be featured on the Union Tribune website and print ads will run prior to the event. The guild banner will go up May 1 at Encinitas Blvd and Hwy 101. Lin also presented a proposal that the guild do away with the featured artist receptions and create a reception that is more beneficial to the community and fits with our guild intentions. (Proposal included in secretary's binder.) Discussion ensued. Topic will be revisited following Mother's Day tour. Lin also recommended not having the Mother's Day tour in 2015. She would like to see the issue disused at a planning session.

#### Webmistress Report - Carol Korfin - Nothing to Report

#### Paint Rag Report – Sharon Hoffman

Sharon inquired the identity of the instructor in the photos from the April reception. She also asked if the paint rag should continue to publish promotions from Rhino Art, PC Photo and Bob Coletti. The board decided this information was useful to the general membership and should continue.

#### Monthly Show Report – Lynn Ely/Jill Treadwell Svendsen

Lynn reported that the last show was a little slow, but that she expects the next one will have good participation.

#### Programs Report – Julie Bubar

Julie reported that the Rachel Edwards demo was well attended with 29 participants. She received a \$50 gift card from Jimbo's and was able to raffle it and several other items for a profit of \$63.

Julie also reported, that due to the restructure of the grant the guild receives from the City of Encinitas, she had scheduled a demo for July that would no longer be covered.

# Motion: Jill Treadwell Svendsen made a motion to approve the request to fund \$260 for the July 14 demo. Sandy Heath seconded. Motion passed: In Favor 14; Against 0; Abstain 0.

Julie also reported on the demos that had been scheduled with the new grant. The first demo would be on precious metal clay and the 2<sup>nd</sup> would feature ancestral Japanese sculptures of James Watts.

Julie continued with a report on the Mother's Day tour. She stated that everything is going great and flyers are out and ready. Approximately 200 tickets have been sold on line and through the gallery. The event is still short 8 docents. Decent training is scheduled for Weds, April 30 and Sat, May 3.

#### Hospitality Report – Devora Safran

Devora reported that the April reception was great and came in on budget due to a wine donation. She also requested to place a sign on the reception table acknowledging the donations. Devora hope to find a more sophisticated way to receive the list of staff for the receptions. It was agreed that monthly show staff would snail mail her the list.

Devora also noted that \$695 had been spent on paper good for the Mother's day tour. If those paper goods went unused she requested that they be returned to hospitality for future receptions.

#### Wall Report- Grace Swanson

#### Rules for Monthly Show

### INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE....

1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.

2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES

3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.

4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be visible.

5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into three entry fee categories:

1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12

2) between 17" and 36" measured on the diagonal: \$17

3) over 36" measured on the diagonal: \$22



Her art has been influenced by Art Residencies in Canada, Japan, Greece, France, Hungary, Korea, Mexico, England, China and the United States.

#### Juror's Statement

I'm looking for artists whose work touches me. While my own work focuses on the narrative and figurative, when I view, curate or jury an exhibition, I look for broader qualities in the art. As I walk through an exhibition, I am always amazed and awed by the complexity and fertility of the artistic mind. My first move is to enjoy the art and take it all in. Each piece has merit. At the second look, I zero on on pieces that make me look closer. This can be for a variety of reasons: technique, uniqueness, content, design. At the third look, I narrow it down to those works which combine many of those qualities, and add something more.

I want something substantial to take home, to think about and have reside in my memory. I want to have benefited by some insight the artist has into the human experience or into aesthetics or into the physical world. The best work will have a certain 'edge', which probes the borders of experience or aesthetics. The subject matter or style is secondary to these considerations.

Some, but not all, of the qualities I look for in art are: conceptional rigor. critical imagination, clarity, distinction, evidence of the creative mind, realization of craft involved, reference to art history, social issues, the psychological, and defining the moment.






Devora was also hoping to purchase a flag banner to advertise the receptions.
