### Message from our President:Lin Holzinger



State of the Guild

If you missed our All Member meeting, you missed some yummy food (thanks to Judy Salinsky and Marissa Wright) and a great time. Almost everyone wore a hat and if they didn't bring one we had supplies on hand for them to custom make their own. Just looking around it was easy to tell that this was a room full of artists with creativity to spare.

Linda Melemed, our Treasurer, gave the financial report for fiscal 2016 - 2017. The good news is that the Gallery paid out nearly \$87,000 to our participating artists! Our ongoing challenge is that the gallery does not produce enough revenue to cover its expenses, so we continue to be dependent upon ticket sales from our Mother's Day Weekend fundraiser in order to keep the gallery open.

That brings me to my next topic - the 24th Annual Mother's Day Art, Garden & Studio Tour. We need help to assure success!!! At this point in time, we have our

artists (36 have signed up) and we're nearly finished selecting the featured houses, so now our biggest need is to have enough Greeters - those folks who sit at the entry way of each house to welcome visitors or to sell tickets. # Encinitas arts program assistant sho

An Encinitas arts department staffer is revealing her own talents in a show now on display.

Cheryl Ehlers, the city's arts program assistant who helps put on art shows throughout Encinitas, presents "Out of Bounds" at the Cardiff-by-the-Sea Library through

The 13 detailed, acrylic pieces reflect Ehlers' unique style using abstract and contemporary techniques. She notes that as viewers walk about the library, they should not be able to immediately identify that all the pieces were done by the same artist, as each piece is distinct from one

Ehlers recently gave a tour of her show to the Encinitas Advocate and spoke about what inspires her and her history as an artist.

#### What was your inspiration behind 'Out of Bounds'?

I named it 'Out of Bounds' because it is everything that I do out of the bounds. I'm multi-genre, so this particular art that's in here is done for a complete abstract show that I do twice a year for the Jazzercise Corp. I curate their art for them, and it's all abstract and eclectic art. ... I just thought since it's bright and it's very vibrant, it brings a great energy to a library. ... You work with the city and have helped put on other people's art shows for five years. What's it like for you now to be in the spotlight at a city venue?


It's always very strange for me



Soravia's painstaking methods and great attention to color variations yielded work that are not only pleasing to behold but have the magical quality of changing before the viewer's eye.





## SDAG August 2018 Gallery Committee Meeting Minutes Linda Melvin's House

August 22, 2018 @ 1-3:30pm

Members Present: Judianne Shannon, Janet Scura, Linda Melvin, Lynn Ely,, Carol Korfin, Lily Pourat Members Absent: Sandy Heath, Ellen Cramer, Joyce Nash.

#### Calendar Chair - Carol Korfin

Carol asked Cheryl DeLain, a member and retired lawyer, for input regarding our bylaws and new forms, especially our new NoShow Policy and forms. She reported feedback from her regarding review of SDAG/OTG Membership Contract, Wall and Floor Rental Contract and policies and forms. Cheryl spoke with others and researched a lot of sources. At present, without spending a lot of money Cheryl felt that what we have in place is okay, but when the membership contract is next reviewed and edited we should consider putting additional wording in for non-compliance issues and get advice as to whether all meet Ca codes. Committee felt that SDAG Membership does not guarantee a rental space in the gallery but is a privilege that comes by meeting requirements and responsibilities.

- 2. Gallery has experienced a "shoplifter" in our store and other stores in the complex. A picture of the individual will be at the front desk for all to see and if he does come in you can ask him to leave since he is not welcome. If you follow him around the store, he does leave on his own. The police have been notified and request that a report be made in regards to items taken. Some renters do not feel comfortable making out a police report but Judianne recommends that one be made for each occurrence so that the police can follow up. Carol will put out an eblast to staffers regarding this issue.
- 3. Judianne reviewed an e-mail that she had received from Pam Waldman regarding multiple safety issues. Judianne will remind all gallery staffers to make sure the back door is locked and deadbolted and that the front door deadbolt is also locked. There have been issues where both have not been locked.
- 4. Judianne will also post at the front desk information on how to get a hold of the maintenance man on duty during daytime hours.
- 5. Judianne presented the new OTG Staff Training Guide just completed by Pam and also wanted everyone to review in the guidebook the section on Medical 'Byes' page 28. The Committee Members took the time to review and then approved as is. Judianne explained the process for getting the new training book out to staff.

#### Wall Chair - Janet Scura (Joyce Nash absent)

- 1. There is one new Renter coming on with the next rotation. His name is David Rickert and his media is oil and acrylic. He has recently moved from Minnesota and is a landscape painter. He is taking a 1/2 wall but would like a full wall when possible.
- 2. Janet said that the clear acrylic biography and business card holders are available for sale now. Joyce has volunteered to handle the money. Card holder is priced at \$2.50 and 8.5x11" bio holder is \$6.50 She recommends that we now make these our standard holders and request those artists using non-clear acrylic to purchase. Both items have a hold on the back so that they can be secured to the wall better that what we have at present.

#### Floor Chair - Linda Melvin

- 1. This is Linda's last gallery meeting as Floor Chair and will now hand over all duties to Lily Pourat. They will meet shortly to go over Floor Chair duties and issues.
- 2. Janet asked if the last Floor Rotation went better with her making sure that Wall Rotation items were put out of the way. Linda said it

was very helpful and asks that the Floor artist do the same for Thursday evenings wall rotation.

#### Monthly Show - Lynn Ely

1. Diann Abadie is now collecting information on all monthly show participants and forwarding on to Judianne and Lily for Jurying information.

#### Jurying-in Coordinator - Lily Pourat

- 1. Judianne discussed that the last 'Jurying-in' meeting went fairly well for the first time a new process was introduced
- 2. Lily has suggested that when she asks for members interested in being juried in she will send a Rental Contract as well as the information she is now sending. She will request that the artists read the contract before committing to being juried in and if they understand and accept the contract terms she will request them to bring a complete copy of the contract with them at the time of submission. This will help her and the committee.
- 3. Janet said that she has received multiple judging criteria and recommends that we have overall categories for judging and more specific categories for each medium
- 4. Carol requested that a category: Workmanship for jewelry be added to the scoring forms. Janet will add
- 5. Janet has also revised the artist jurying scorecard per Lily's request to be 1/2 page each to save paper. Janet has done this and Lily reviewed. Janet will sent Lily electronic copies of both scoring sheets and the Wall/Floro Rental Contract for her use at each jurying.

#### Gallery Manager - Judianne Shannon

- 1. Day, time and place for next year Gallery Committee Meeting were voted on by the committee. Meetings will be set for Thursdays @10:30 am at the US Bank, Ralph Shopping Center, on El Camino Real in Encinitas.
- 2. Judianne discussed the moving of the front desk slightly to accommodate the new shelves for the bookshelf stand.
- 3. Judianne brought guidelines for Gallery Committee discussion regarding the types of books that artists already have submitted to her for jurying in. Guidelines; Books must be written or illustrated by artist, Table Books of art or photography need to have, at least, an in-depth forward or introduction; especially if there is no information or title with images. TheArt Book must be more than just copies of artist's work within a book, it should say something about the subject matter, artist, etc, Books can be hard or soft covers. Books can be published or self published by the artist but the quality of the book must be of high standard. An artist's bio would be a good addition. Pricing should be added by the artist and make sure there is proper identification for the staff when selling.

#### Calendar Chair - Carol Korfin

Due to increasing number of staffing no shows over the last few months, Carol sent out a notice to all staffers reminding them that it is THEIR RESPONSIBILITY to write their staffing dates in their own calendars correctly and that they should check the notice that comes after signing up, the 2 day reminder notice and the day before phone call, the latter two being COURTESY calls.

#### Wall Chair - Janet Scura & Joyce Nash

- 1. Joyce has notified wall renters who have not paid their annual membership dues that they must submit their payment before they will be allowed to hang their work during rotation
- 2. Joyce says that she will be taking the money for wall rentals as well as any purchases of the new clear acrylic business card and 8.5" x 10" bio holders and will submit them together to Linda Melemed
- 3. Janet suggested that we try to encourage those wall renters that at present are using non clear acrylic holders to change to the new holders and that we should make the clear holders a standard moving forward.

#### Floor Chair - Lily Pourat

- 1. Lily says that she has been working with Linda Melvin to get acquainted with her new position as Floor Chair
- 2. She said that she has been calling those floor renters who have not paid their annual membership dues to tell them that they are required to pay prior to continuing to display their work.
- 3. Judianne said that the Chairs should take into account that there may be certain situations when a renter can not pay their dues prior to rotation. Arrangements could be made to have the payment made as soon as possible in this case.
- 4. Joyce said that she is working on the September Rotation map for the floor and will have it to Lily as soon as possible.
- Lily made a suggestion that when the sculpture cube is not being used by a 3D artist that a coordinated display of artists work could be placed there. Judianne said that at present she has been placing some of the new books for sale there for viewing.
- 6. Judianne has been working with Diann Abadie on the new process and report for logging Monthly Show participants. This report will help Lily with the artist jurying qualification for being in 3 monthly shows prior to being juried in for wall or floor rental. Diann has been sending the monthly report to Judianne for distribution.

#### Jurying-in Coordinator - Lily Pourat

- Judianne and Lily are finalizing the Jury Team Members. Being a Jury Team Member will qualify as the artist job for the gallery.
- 2. The Committee agreed that there should be other artist members besides BOD and Wall and Floor Chairs to Jury-in artists. Lily said that as Jurying Coordinator she would not be a juror unless absolutely necessary.
- 3. Jurying typically occurs approximately every other month unless there is not a sufficient number of artist to jury. The Committee agreed that the Monday of the second week of the month would be set for the Jurying Committee Meetings. Lily said that the previous 9 -10 am time for juried art drop off worked well and that Jurying Team should not arrive before 10am so that the potential rental artist do not communicate with the jurors before the jurying process. Lily also stated that in the past November and May were not good months for jurying and will not be

scheduled months for the Committee. Lily will send out a call for artist approximately 15 days before each meeting. This will help both artists to be juried and the committed with advanced notice. The next Jurying Committee meeting is tentatively scheduled for October.

#### Monthly Show - Lynn Ely

- 1. Lynn said that recently there have been a few issues with Monthly Show participants wanting to submit both very large and weighty works that cannot be accommodated on the monthly show wall space. At present the monthly show diagonal size criteria is a follows: 17" and under \$12, 18-36" \$17 and 37" and greater \$22. She suggests that an upper diagonal size limit be set for entries and also a weight limit. Janet suggested that she monitor existing acceptable piece sizes and weight while determining these limits. Carol volunteered to donate a suitcase hanger scale to the gallery for weighing artwork when necessary.
- 2. Janet also suggested that the new limitations be communicated through the Monthly Show policies, Monthly Show Procedures and on the handout labeled "Monthly Show's Seven most Frequently Asked Questions".
- 3. Judianne said that there are a few new members that have made suggestion regarding hanging for the monthly shows

#### <u>Gallery Manager</u> - Judianne Shannon

- 1. Judianne stated that there has been considerable damage to the floor caused by flooding in the adjacent restroom. She and Linda have been working with the Lumberyard management to look into the matter.
- There has been a front desk change with removal of the cash register and a new cash drawer. Pam Waldman has
  created a new section for the Staff Training Manual to reflect these changes. Since a recent order for 100 copies of
  the present manual was ordered, they will be corrected to reflect the these changes and added to the next edition
  when printed.
- 3. A suggestion was made by Ursula and Joyce from the Demo Committee for "Show and Sell" and was discussed in length by the gallery committee. It was determined that the present "Featured Artist" and Demo displays were enough exposure for our artists.
- 4. Shoplifter report: the person that is being monitored has been around less frequently and when he does come in he is directed out of the store without issues. Security cameras have been studied and at present the committee felt they were not needed. Staffers should be encouraged to walk the floor more often during their shift.
- 5. Judianne said that the new acrylic holders for medium and large 2D prints should be in any day and will be hung shortly. These will eliminate the need for most of the bins in the back. One might be kept for extra large works. The Card and 2D art now has a new process for logging and monitoring with a new cards filing system.
- 6. A Seasonal Themed Gift Center was discussed by Judianne. The space will be rented by any SDAG member but all items will be juried to qualify for the area. Participants that are present renters will not be required to have a additional job. Other member artists participating will need to assist with a job related to the STGC. Judianne will finalize procedures etc. and report to the committee. It was suggested that Judianne look into an alternative to the present Christmas tree for hanging holiday items.

# SDAG October 2018 Gallery Committee Meeting Minutes US Bank @ El Camino Real October 19, 2018 @ 10:30 am

Members Present: Judianne Shannon, Janet Scura, Carol Korfin, Lily Pourat, Joyce Nash

Members Absent: Sandy Heath, Ellen Cramer, Lynn Ely

#### **Old Business**

#### 1. Membership Renewals - Judianne Shannon

At the last BOD meeting the issue of setting a cut off date for membership payments and the Gallery Committee was asked to determine the date and the outcome if not paid. Would the member would lose their right to show their artwork until they had made their membership payment. It was agreed that for <u>Active</u> Memberships their status would be deactivated after Nov 1st (60 days) and that the <u>Regular</u> Membership status (those showing art in the gallery) would have a 30 day deadline of Oct 1st to make their paymen If an artists payment is not received by that date, his or her artwork would be removed from the gallery until a payment was made.

#### 2. Information Regarding Jurying Process - Judianne Shannon

The Jurying Committee recently put processes in place for jurying in new artists as renters. One outstanding item was when does th Jurying Coordinator needs to receive the list of Monthly Show participants from Abadie so that she can verify that the artists to be juried in have shown in at least 3 Monthly Shows. It was determined that it would be best if she received the information by the 5th of the month following the Monthly Show Take-in.

#### 3. Reception and/or Monthly Show Featured Artists consideration

There has been a request that SDAG/OTG consider featuring Veteran artists during next year's Veteran's Day in October. A lengthy discussion ensued and after reviewing various options the committee has tentatively decided that it would be nice for the Gallery to recognize our Gallery veteran artists as well as those in the community. It was decided that our SDAG/OTG renter artists would be recognized with a tag of some sort by their work (to be determined later) and that community veterans who would like to show their art at the gallery would be allowed to enter the October Monthly Show without becoming a member, receive a 50% discount on Monthly Show fee and be recognized as a Veteran by their artwork. Since the Monthly Show Chair was not at the meeting the plan would need to be presented to her for approval.

#### Monthly Show - Lynn Ely absent

Judianne mentioned that there were several Monthly Show participants that did not show for their assigned jobs that they had signed up for at the Monthly Show. The committee discussed that we should look at the processes that we have in place that might not communicate well enough the participants obligation to fulfill their assigned job. The Monthly Show 'No Show' Invoice was reviewed and it was felt that the fine for not showing for his/her job should be increased to \$20 as well as the \$10 fee if they had not signed up for a job. It is the committee's hope that this would stress the importance of the assigned job and would be a disincentive for not showing for agreed assigned job. Signage at the MS Jobis table indicating the importance of a job commitment was recommended.

#### Calendar Chair - Carol Korfin

One of our current members has not paid his membership as well as not staffed his assigned shift. Carol has been unable to reach the member regarding these issues. It was recommended that Jeff Brosbe, 'No Show' Central Post so that he can send an invoice for not showing for his OTG staffing job.

#### Wall Co-Chairs - Janet Scura & Joyce Nash

- 1. Joyce Nash said that this past rotation was problematic for receiving payments. There is still one outstanding payment. She has been unable to reach the artist and was concerned that there might be a medical problem. Judianne said that she would follow up with the artist to make sure all was well.
- 2. It has been brought to the attention of the Wall Co-Chairs that on the morning after Thursday evenings rotation many of the supplies for hanging have been left out. Janet said that this has been reported several times and she for one was there at

- the last Thursday evening rotation and helped the assistant put away all supplies. There was one outstanding artist who had not hung when they left, This same artist hangs after hours since he works evenings. Jan recommended that we send a communications to him to make sure that he remember to put all supplies that he uses away when he finishes hanging.
- 3. It was brought to Joyce's attention that there was an artist that had hung this last rotation a quilted art piece without it being framed. It is the gallery policy that quilted artwork be framed. Joyce will send an email to the artist stating that it is the gallery policy that quilted art be framed

#### Floor Chair - Lily Pourat

- 1. Lily worked with Linda on the last rotation for orientation to her new job and she had many questions for the committee.
- 2. She had at least one renter who didn't pay her rental fee. She has sent a notice to pay and has taken her work off the floor and placed in the back room. (what do we do with empty space because of this?)
- 3. Lily asked how the notification for rent due worked in the past prior to rotation. Joyce explained that she was told to send out a notice of upcoming rotation and a reminder that rental payment was due approximately 30 days prior to rotation. She sends a second notice 2 weeks before rotation and then another notice 1 week before rotation. It was agreed that having renters bring their payment on rotation day was very difficult to keep up with and all recommended that payment should be made prior to rotation day. It was also recommended that those renters that submit a payment to Joyce or Lily in the back office also email them to make sure they know a check is there and the artist can be checked that a payment was made
- 4. Lily also asked about those renters that can't staff but have someone staff for them. The committee said that anyone that sits for a renter must be trained as a staffer and SDAG member. The arrangement between the renter and their substitute is between them. There are several artists that have family members sit for them.

#### <u>Jurying-in Coordinator</u> - Lily Pourat

1. The committee discussed the number of artists needed to hold a jurying. Lily told them that many times people say that they want to be juried in and agree to be at the jurying meeting but do not show up. Because of this she always wants at least 5 interested artists before setting the meeting date. It was recommended that Lily put in her notice to the interested artists that it is important for them to let her know ahead of time if an he/she can't make it. This is a courtesy to both the other artists wishing to be juried-in and the jurors.

#### Gallery Manager - Judianne Shannon

- 1. Gallery Floor Judianne and Linda Melvin have finally communicated with the Lumberyard Manager, Donna and her maintenance man regarding the water damage to the floor and wall in the gallery from the men's bathroom.. A leak was supposedly fixed but appears to still be there causing flooding in the gallery. It is tentatively schedule for repair to the wall on, Monday & Tuesday and if this is confirmed, the gallery will be closed both of those days. The staff would be notified by Sunday in this case.\* (as of 10/21/2018 Lumberyard was a no show for Gallery Repairs-need to discuss problem further)
- 2. There have been more changes in the gallery. The wiring under the desk has been reworked and looks much neater and is safer. Judianne is still working on the acrylic bins for 2D wraps. They have been ordered and should be in shortly. These new bins will make room for the seasonal themed gift center.
- 3. Gallery Books: Gallery Training Manual, Staffing Guide and SDAG Reference Book are nearing completion. The present front desk book will be dedicated to staffing only. There will be a second book for staff training and a third book that will be a SDAG reference for all other policies, procedures, activities and forms.
- 4. Lastly, the committee needs to determine if the Digital Slide Show should continue. If yes, there needs to be a chair to make sure interested artists pay for representation, the images are updated regularly and images are photographed as needed. Judianne will discuss with Pam Waldman and Grace Swanson..

# Off track gallery reopens: Local artists pull together to remedy plumbing mishap

Exhibiting artists at Off Track have been busily working toward reopening their gallery, which they did Nov. 6, after faulty plumbing caused a leak that seeped under the gallery floor, causing it to discolor and buckle.

The leakage began gradually, taking months before it became noticeable and possibly threatening to gallery contents. Gallery Manager Judianne Shannon and the guild's president, Linda Melvin, worked closely with the center's management and maintenance department to determine the extent of the damage and a course of action.

"Once it became obvious that the flooring had to be replaced, all artwork needed to be removed to prevent possible damage, especially to our display furnishings" Shannon said. "It's been a huge job, since more than 100 artists and

several hundred pieces of art had to be moved out of our space and then be returned. But as is typical of our members, they responded quickly and were more than willing to help to get the job done."
