Gourd Show installed at Carlsbad Library

Grace Swanson, local gourd artist, recently installed a show of her gourd artwork in the lighted case in the Virginia Cole Library, 1250 Carlsbad Village Drive. The show will be visible until March.

"My interest in gourds began as a small child, born and raised in Nigeria. The Nigerian people use gourds for everything from storing food to spoons to holding cosmetics. When I saw a class on gourd art offered by San Diego Botanic Garden I decided to give it a try. The feel and smell of the burning gourd just took me 'home'. I was hooked, " said Swanson.

Swanson purchases her gourds from Welburn Gourd Farm just north of Fallbrook uncleaned and uncut. First she soaks and scrubs farm dirt and the mold off of the gourds. Then she looks at each gourd carefully for any flaws or cracks. Each gourd has its own personality and that often dictates what design she will burn into the gourd and whether it will stay whole or become an opened vessel. The mold that forms on the gourds makes patterns that can be used or disregarded depending on the design. Sometimes she says that she has a very definite design in mind when she begins and sometimes she makes it up as she goes along. Some gourds may take as little as two or three hours to complete. Others may take days or weeks.

The gourds are cut, dremeled, sanded, dyed, carved, painted, beaded and finished with either gourd wax or an acrylic spray. The surface of a good quality gourd is almost like wood. The difference is that there is an outer "skin" that is smooth. Dyes and paint can be wiped off. Beneath this skin is a softer flesh that absorbs dye and paint very readily and can create very interesting effects.

Gourds are grown in many shapes and sizes ranging from tiny "jewelry" gourds to very large ones used as drums. Even though no two gourds are the exact shape and are never perfectly round or symmetrical, there are some basic

shape including apple, bottle, canteen, pear, snake and so on.

Throughout history gourds have been utilitarian. They have been used as spoons, bowls, drums, and storage containers for water, wine, grain etc. Some of Swanson's gourds may serve a function as vessels and bowls. However, most of Swanson's designs are meant to be appreciated for its own sake. Gourds can easily slip into the area of craft — painted to look like snowmen, Santas, and little animals - or made into lamps and bird houses. This, however, does not appeal to her. She prefers to see how elegant, simple and sophisticated the lowly gourd can

"Gourds have taken over my life. My brushes, paints and canvas have been pushed to one side as I explore the wonderfully tactile, three-dimensional world of gourds." Swanson's gourds are sold through the Off Track Gallery located at 937 South Coast Highway 101, Suite C-103 (behind Starbucks), downtown Encinitas, CA 92024. 
Vilma Ruth 'Vel' Malmberg



In all categories except photography, reproductions of original artworks are not eligible for awards. The Monthly Show take-in day is usually the last Tuesday of the month (check website for schedule).

Wall/Floor Display

After participation in three monthly shows, members may apply for wall or floor (three dimensional artwork) Licensing to Display. Juries for these spaces take place four times a year. Once juried in, members are placed on a waiting list. Licensee-Artists staff the gallery for a period of time each month. SAN DIEGUITO ART GUILD MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY 20, 2019

The Board of Directors held its monthly meeting on Monday, May 20, 2019 at US Bank in Encinitas. In attendance were Sharon Hoffman, Carol Korfin, Linda Melvin, Judianne Shannon, Grace Swanson, Karen Fidel, Lily Pourat, Linda Melemed, Judy Salinsky and Jon Lovegren.

Absent were Jeff Brosbe, Lynn Ely, Lin Holzinger, Joyce Nash, Marissa Wright and PJ Puterbaugh. Linda Melvin called the meeting to order at 10:10am. She announced that due to an accident, Lin Holzinger will be unable to finish the fiscal year as Secretary. Karen Fidel will be Acting Secretary until a new Secretary is voted in. Sharon Hoffman has taken over as Newsletter Editor. Sharon Ford has resigned the position.

<u>Minutes</u> – Karen moved to approve the April 22, 2019 minutes as emailed to the board via email with corrections from Lin Holzinger, seconded by Linda Melvin, unanimously approved. Copy attached.

<u>Treasurers Report</u> – Linda Melemed gave a summary of the financials she previously emailed to the board. Copy attached. Carol made a motion to accept the financial report, seconded by Judianne, unanimously approved.

Membership – Karen told the Board that the Membership Renewal campaign will begin in a few months. It was agreed that we would not raise dues for the next fiscal year. Karen asked for clarification of how to handle Off Track Gift Certificates if the customer has change coming – cash or a new Certificate for the balance. Linda Melemed recommended, and it was agreed, that a new Gift Certificate be issued for the balance.

Fund Raising – Sharon gave a brief report about the Mothers Day Tour. We sold 975 tickets, similar to prior years' sales, even with the threat of rain this year. Final accounting will be submitted by Treasurer. Approximately \$21,000 profit. The Plumleigh house had the most visitors at 1013 people, and the least was 807 visitors. Houses further out in Carlsbad had the least visitors. The Raffle winner was Nancy Walker. Karen's interim Income and Expense Report does not yet reflect all expenses, but is attached for reference. Sharon commented that we need better greeter training and as well as better training for the staff at the gallery selling tickets.

PR – Grace advised that Michael Chesnut is the only featured artist at the reception/art tour on June 1. The next reception/art tours are the first Saturday in June, August and October, and November 23.

Judy advised that the TV monitor is not working properly and would like to take it down. The Board agreed. Judianne would like to raise the jewelry shelves that are under the monitor.

Judy is looking into advanced marketing workshops/classes for social media such as Facebook and Instagram. Grace made a motion that we pay for any classes that Judy takes, seconded by Sharon Hoffman, unanimously approved.

Floor Chair – Lily advised that Dave Ombrella is leaving. One cube is empty and 4 people are renting extra space in that cube at the next rotation. Bruce Stewart wants to rent a cube for small images. After discussion, it was agreed that he cannot rent floor space for wall art. He would have to jury in for 3D items and then could put in up to five other small pieces not to cover more than 20% of cube space. Carol made a motion to approve that the Floor Licensee-Artists must display the majority of their main 3D or jewelry juriedin media in their floor display spaces. This specifically involves the 3D cubes along with the jewelry towers and jewelry shelves. Each artist in these floor display areas may have up to five additional pieces of other juried-in mediums, but are not to cover more than 20% of their display space. Karen seconded, unanimously approved.

Grace suggested that we use some of the Monthly Show space for special shows as needed, such as for students and veterans.

<u>Gallery Chair</u> – Judianne emailed the Gallery Committee Report to the Board, attached. She discussed the highlights of that report. Discussion was had about when the gallery was closed for repairs and if we could get compensation for the \$7,000 in lost sales. Linda Melvin will discuss with property management.

<u>Newsletter</u> – Sharon would like to reinstate listing paid sitters in the newsletter and also an article about Monthly Show take-in requirements and a reference to the website.

Old Business - Jon emailed the board his proposed changes to the By-Laws and Individual Citations of Relevant California Code Sections, attached. He gave a summary of these reports. Carol emailed the Legal Committee response and read it to the Board, copy attached. Linda Melvin requested that we table further discussion until all of the Legal Committee can be present.

<u>Adjournment</u> – Karen moved to adjourn the meeting at 12:20pm, seconded by Judianne, unanimously approved.

It has come to our attention that Vilma Malmberg the last of the 12 founding members of SDAG passed away on October 18, 2018. She was 88. On June 8, 2013 a very special artist reception was held for her at the Off Track Gallery.

SDNEWS.com reported that: "Vilma's art interest started at age three. Fast forward some years, she majored in Art Education and picked up a few scholarships in Chicago, and taught art at the Illinois State University. Moving to California in 1958, she continued art studies at San Diego State. She saw art in everything. Traveling widely and living in both England and Jas oon, sparked her interest in Asian art She continued to be inspired by nature, especially

the western coastline and became proficient in pastels, watercolors and Chinese brush work. She is a skilled self-taught artist who is open to numerous styles' of painting and very good at interpretation.

mbered the history of the San Dieguita Art Guild very well.

"One day in 1965 fellow artist, Sue Beere, called together friends and neighbors for coffee at her Del Mar home and together they mapped out a vision. There were no other art groups in North San Diego Country at that time. The first people involved in the San Dieguito Art Guild were a mixture of people with a lot of art training or none at all. The main interest was to foster art and to provide a place to display it. We found a small storefront in Del Mar, our first gallery, and a lot of starving artist sales were used to pay the rent. The membership grew and flourished with some good years and some bad.

We managed to move around in three locations in Del Mar. The San Dieguita Art Galley rented the building where the Del Mar Library is now on the corner of 13th and Comina del Mar from 1969-1970. The building was the old St. James Catholic Church. During the time that the guild rented the building it was up for sale and Sue Beere and I wanted to buy it. I was prepared to put my own money into the building and get a mortgage. That did not happen. The building eventually was so and became the Albatross Restaurant before it became the Del Mar Library. I was discouraged and to this day I still think about the memory that could have been".

At age 84 (at the time of her 2013 reception). Vilma was still active in the arts and a delight to speak to. She expressed her gratitude to her fellow artists, which she calls a "great group of gals". Her passion and love of art have kept her painting. which she simply states, "I love everything about it. My favorites are nature. These days, I am working on abstracts". She remains an active supporter and participant in the Guild's Monthly Show exhibits and a delightful role model for younger artists whom she encourages to participate in the guild.

"I care deeply about the San Diequito Art Guild and what it represents. It takes a lot of volunteers and time to keep it going - they are very special folks and I am still proud to be part of the organization," says Vilma.

Rules for Monthly Show

INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE ...

- If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.
 All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES 3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side
- 4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be
- 5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into these entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
 2) between 18" and 32" measured on the diagonal: \$17
 3) over 33" to 48" measured on the diagonal: \$25
- 4) anything measuring over 48" will be accepted at the discretion of the monthly

Contact Lynn Ely (Monthly Show Chair) at for more details on these categories and also about exhibiting 3-dimensional artwork.

All Monthly Show entries must remain on display for the entire month unless sold. They may then be replaced with a similar size and type of artwork.

2019 marks the 25th anniversary of the annual Heritage Tree Lighting Ceremonyl So what better way to commemorate the occasion than with a design contest! We're asking residents of Encinitas to submit their best tree-topper ideas by June 30th.

Encinitas' famed Heritage tree was planted in 1952 by two brothers, Peter and John Danforth. The now 87' tall Norfolk Pine. located at 4 th Street and C Street above Moonlight Beach, was designated by the City of Encinitas as a "Heritage Tree" in 2011, the second tree in Encinitas to achieve this protected status. Today the tree is adorned once a year with LED lights, then lit up on a Friday, the day before the city's annual Christmas parade, signifying the official beginning of the city's annual holiday season. The Encinitas Historical Society serves as the event's official sponsor.

Starting in 1994, local long-time resident, Luis Ortiz, was inspired to light up the tree. Approaching the Danforth family, he was given permission to string lights on the tree. Luis donated his time and money, along with donations from the community and labor from his local buddles, to start what has now become an annual Encinitas tradition. Luis kept at it, reaching out to the community to keep the tradition going, annually raising funds and donations of labor and equipment to light up the tree. He recruited neighbors and merchants to support the effort, an effort that has grown into the annual tradition it has become.

Helping Luis behind the scenes for nearly twenty years, Jim Filanc took over event management and encee duties in 2015. He collaborated with the Encinitas Historical Society to serve as the event's official sponsor. In 2017, the Encinitas Historical Society raised \$24,000 to pay for a permanent power supply, saving an annual aperating costs. As a result, the Heritage tree now hos its own address, 406 4 th Street. Today, the event has grown to include local chorales, musicians and school choirs, with crowds swelling to nearly five hundred.

and retired drama teacher who taught in the San Dieguito Union High School District.



The Board of Directors held its monthly meeting at U.S. Bank in Encinitas on June 24, 2019. In attendance were Linda Melvin, Karen Fidel, Judianne Shannon, Linda Melemed, Sharon Hoffman, Grace Swanson, Jeff Brosbe and Jon Lovegren. Judy Salinsky, Lynn Ely and Marissa Wright arrived at 10:12 after the meeting was called to order and after the first motion to accept the minutes. Lily Pourat arrived at 10:30am. Absent were Joyce Nash, Carol Korfin and PJ Puterbaugh.

Approval of Minutes: Linda Melemed made a motion to accept the minutes as emailed by Karen to the board after the last meeting. Judianne seconded. Unanimously approved by the members in attendance at the time.

Treasurer's Report: Linda Melemed emailed financial statements to the board. She said that of particular concern was that year to date profit this year was \$1730 vs prior year for the same period was \$26,322, about \$25,000 less profit so far this fiscal year. This is due to higher gallery rent and other expenses and lower artist sales. Also, the gallery was closed for two weeks for repairs resulting is lost sales of about \$7000. Linda Melvin said she would contact the property manager to see if we can get some kind of compensation or reduction in rent.

Linda Melemed also reported final Mothers Day income was \$31,036, Expenses were \$11,619, for a net total income of \$19,417. \$1400 that had already been given to middle and high school students in scholarships will be paid from Mothers Day income in addition to the \$1500 to be awarded at the August reception to the MiraCosta students bring the total to \$29.00

Fundraising and Newsletter – Sharon Hoffman said she will take over doing the Monthly Show spreadsheet to track artist participation to be sure jurying artists have met the three show requirement. Judianne will contact Diann Abadie about the change, and Jeff will find Diann a new job.

Jon Lovegren advised that he has an Avery Wizard program that he can put on our computer in the back room to make labels.

PR – Grace said she needs a full wall for student art for the month of August. Jeff volunteered his wall space for the month. He and Grace will work out the details. Jeff will only pay for one month hanging fee. Grace was advised by Marissa that we will need more wine by the next reception.

Judy is working on getting members to work on social media. Floor Manager: Lily advised that Ellablanche's cube will be empty by the end of the month, leaving two whole unrented sets of cubes. Harvey Korfin expressed interest in renting a whole set of cubes. Lily will follow up with him. For the other empty set of cubes, Lily will rent each shelf in the cube individually for \$46 each. All items in the cubes must be juried in first.

Lily said that Bobbi Hirschkoff has again asked to put her garden stakes in a special stand in the gallery. The board said they have already denied this request and the answer is still no.

Jobs Chair: Jeff discussed student certificates for scholarships. Linda Melvin advised that she does not want to give out certificates next year. Jeff advised that scholarship process needs to start earlier in the school year.

Grace said that the six presentations should be a different job, perhaps by Laura Lowenstein. Linda Melemed suggested giving the money next year to a different organization

that handles donations so we wouldn't have to make the presentations ourselves.

Jeff talked about and clarified the "No Show" form that he will be sending out to several people and will send copies to the wall and floor chairs.

New Business: Linda Melvin said that TERi is asking for a monetary donation. Linda Melemed suggested that we wait until next year.

Chasing Coral – Cheryl Ehlers is in charge of putting on an event at the Community Center on July 6. Linda Melvin will get further details. If this is a viable event for the guild, Karen volunteered to coordinate. INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE....

- 1. If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also
- 2. All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES
- 3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.

 4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be
- 5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into these entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- 2) between 18" and 32" measured on the diagonal: \$17



Approval of Minutes

Motion: Karen Fidel made a motion to accept the minutes as submitted by email after the last board meeting. Lily Pourat seconded, and the minutes were unanimously approved.

Secretary's Report - Lin Holzinger has resumed her duties after a 2-month hiatus due to an injury.

Treasurers Report - Linda Melemed presented the financial report. She requested everyone delay spending on non-essential items until the start of the new fiscal year in order to limit this year's losses.

Highlights included that sales are down \$4500 from the year before, MDay results were \$5000 down from the year before and a few unexpected and one time expenses were generated, such as \$2000 to be part of the Historical Society's book project. These issues generated a discussion among members as to the importance of creating a budget for the upcoming fiscal year. Linda mentioned that she has 6 years of year over year comparisons to ascertain averages for each category. Linda emphasized that each Chair needs to reinforce the need for their approval before committee members purchase items and that reimbursement requests should be signed by the Chairs before being submitted to the Treasurer for payment.

Grace Swanson stated that reducing expenses was vital but we need to also look toward generating additional income in order to improve the overall financial picture. Grace mentioned a need to find someone to Chair a committee to generate off-site shows which can be a money maker for the Guild. The Jobs Chair will add that to the jobs list. Motion: Karen Fidel made a motion to accept the Treasurer's verbal report. Judianne Shannon seconded, and the financials were unanimously approved.

Membership Report – Karen Fidel had nothing to report at this time although an updated membership list was sent to the BOD this past week. Publicity Report – Grace talked about how important it is for our marketing efforts and the Gallery itself to strive to be relevant for 'today' in order to appeal to a younger demographic. Grace reminded the Board that most of us are sixty-plus years of age and may not be as current as we consider ourselves to be. We don't want to appear to be "dated." On that note, Judy Salinsky gave an extensive presentation on the increasing importance of social media in the Gallery's marketing mix, especially the need for a vital Instagram program, which has increased in popularity. Recently, Judy worked with a few members who are very social media savvy and are willing to help us update our image both online and in the Gallery. She told us that in today's world, our website should be under the umbrella of social media.

Judy's presentation generated a lengthy discussion about what should take precedence with regard to board positions, since the group would vote to approve next year's slate at the end of today's meeting. It was then determined that for the foreseeable future, Social Media will require a concerted, ongoing effort and so social media should be elevated to a seat on the Board and website duties (which currently consists of posting and updating) would be a job under that Chair.

Motion: Judy Salinsky made a motion to revise the Board Chair positions with Social Media Chair taking the place of Website Chair. Cheryl DeLain seconded the motion. Judianne Shannon abstained from the vote and the motion was approved.

Calendar Report – Carol Korfin reported that a few renters decided to stop exhibiting at the gallery earlier than scheduled which can challenge gallery staffing. It was decided that a more detailed discussion of the 60-day rule for renters would be reviewed at the next Gallery Committee meeting with the results presented at the August BOD meeting. Wall Report – No report as Joyce Nash was absent due to car trouble. Floor Report – Lily Pourat discussed shared cubicles due to open spaces. The Gallery Committee minutes (attached) include details of some changes made regarding 3D art and the cubicles.

Jobs Report – Cheryl deLain will be filling in for Jeff Brosbe who is dealing with health issues. She will update the jobs list and send out to the Board shortly.

Monthly Show Report – Lynn Ely announced take-in is tomorrow. This month's juror is Julie Weaverling and Cheryl Tall will be the juror in August. Based on feedback from her monthly show participants, Lynn has decided not to suggest themes for the time being as they are sometimes considered to be restrictive although she does encourage lots of color!

Lynn and Judianne talked about the upcoming monthly show will honor Veterans in the fall and that there will be no entry fee to either member or non-member participants. However, Judianne will send an email to those who have signed up reinforcing the rule that the Gallery will take its 15% on sales as usual.

Gallery Manager Report – Judianne Shannon referred to her committee report (attached) on several topics. There was some brief discussion about demos which have been discontinued due to lack of appropriate space in the Gallery and lack of permission from center's management to have them outside the Gallery.

Website Report – Jon Lovegren was absent.

Hospitality Report – Marissa Wright had nothing to report but did ask for help in determining her budget for next year. Discussion ensued. Newsletter Report – Sharon Hoffman had nothing to report at this time. Other Business:

Nominations

Linda Melemed, Nominating Committee Chair, presented the names of next year's slate of officers, including Judy Salinsky as Social Media Chair instead of the discontinued Website Chair.

Motion: Karen Fidel made a motion to accept the slate as presented by Linda. Carol Korfin seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

Legal Committee Presentation and Resolution

Cheryl DeLain read the above document to the Board for consideration prior to making a motion. The resolution assures that SDAG is in compliance with California law having been fully reviewed by attorney, Darryl Solberg, a nonprofit specialist. Cheryl DeLain will retain all pertinent correspondence relating to the resolution.

Motion: Karen Fidel made a motion to accept the resolution as presented. Judy Salinsky seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

Note: The next BOD meeting will be a short business meeting and pot luck luncheon(outgoing and incoming members of the BOD are invited) and will be hosted by Carol and Harvey Korfin at their home. Meeting adjourned: Linda Melemed called for the meeting to be adjourned at 12:30 pm. Grace Swanson seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.





Local artist to be featured on Australian TV show

Peggy Stokes, an artist based in Solana Beach, will be featured on the Australian TV series "Colour in Your Life," with an all-day filming session in her home studio scheduled for Sept. 11.

"It's fantastic to have this opportunity," said Stokes, a Michigan native who moved to San Diego 30 years ago. "It doesn't come along very often."

The show, launched in 2011 and hosted by artist Graeme Stevenson, provides a 24-minute look at different artists in their studios, giving them an opportunity to share their work in front of a global audience. The show airs in 15 countries, and can be viewed on YouTube. Stokes said she reached out to the show two months ago, and received a call two days later about appearing in an episode. The episode with Stokes will be part of the show's "Hot August Nights U.S. Film Tour." Stokes, a self-taught artist, spent the first 35 years of her career as a photographer. For the last three years, she's been working with alcohol inks. The fast-drying inks are poured onto a canvas, and can be manipulated by tilting the canvas in multiple directions, resulting in a series of free-form shapes, lines and fillings. They can be further altered by pouring rubbing alcohol on them, and the lines and shapes typically continue



BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE.

- If your work is on a wrapped convas, make sure that the edges are pointed also.
 All well art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or SCREW EYES.
- 3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side
- 4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be
- 5. The edges of the wire need to be taped to protect against injury.





Rules for Monthly Show

INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE...

- If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are pointed also.
 All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS or
- SCREW PYES
- 3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the side.

 4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will not be
- 5. The edges of the wire need to be toped to protect against injury.

NOTE THAT DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON SOME SHOWS ARE SHORTENED AND PRO-RATED SO FEES CHANGE FOR THOSE SHOWS,

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into these entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- 2) between 18" and 32" measured on the diagonal: \$17
- 3) over 33" to 48" measured on the diagonal: \$25



Call to order: 10:00 by Linda Melvin, President.

Motion: Linda Melvin moved to accept the minutes from the October meeting; Linda Melemed

seconded. Minutes from September were unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report - Linda Melemed presented the financial summary report (previously

emailed to all BOD members). Cash on hand as of October 31st was \$152,528. Artist sales for

the year ended October 31st were \$12,734 up from the prior year sales of \$12,417. Net profit

Year to Date is \$10,767 up from the prior year profit of \$7,333.

Motion: Cheryl DeLain moved to accept the Treasurer's Report; Janet Weinstein seconded.

Treasurer's Report was unanimously approved.

Membership - Karen Fidel was absent; no report.

Fundraising - Sharon Hoffman reported that the first Mother's Day event planning meeting was

held on November 15th with core committee members present. The artist application is ready

(with fee increased from \$85 to \$95) and many positions on the team are filled. Next planning

meeting is January 8th. Four or five houses have been committed, but still looking for one near

Bumann Ranch. Artist registration will take place January 16th and 18th, and two greeter

training sessions will be May 2nd and May 5th. The committee is still looking for a

photographer for the booklet. There will be a \$100 gift card to the Cohn group of restaurants

(costing \$65 from Costco) for the raffle. Cheryl DeLain offered to ask the Cohn group if they

would donate the gift card for the raffle.

Publicity - Grace Swanson reported that the next reception will be in February. Staff needs to

stay until 9:30pm for the reception, since we have coordinated our reception time with Art

Night Encinitas, but staff have only been scheduled until 8pm. Carol Korfin, Calendar Chair,

will be notified so that she can adjust the staff hours for reception evenings. It was suggested

that while it's busy during receptions it might be nice to have additional staff, like a "gopher" to

help with wrapping sold items, calling the artists whose work sold, and just providing extra

eyes on the gallery.

The topic of sculpture space was discussed with regard to rotating the work or not due to size

of works and available spaces. Linda Melvin suggested she would gather an appropriate

group of members at the gallery to look at options and make a recommendation.

Grace Swanson further reported that publicity for the December 14th bazaar is going well. The

volunteer of the year email will go out soon. And it was decided that for the Community Center

show in spring it will be Board Members only. Participants will support the reception(s) with

food and their presence.

Calendar Report - Carol Korfin was absent, no report.

Wall Report - Deborah Buffington reported that Hao Aiken has given her 60 day notice and will

receive her deposit back. Constance Gibony juried in in April and will take Hal's spot. (Note -

we will need a new graphics person when Hao leaves).

All payments from wall artists have been received.

Note: when contacting Deborah Buffington please use her home phone number, not cell.

Floor Report - Lily Pourat reported that all payments from floor artists have been received.

Jobs Report - (Cheryl DeLain acting for Jeff Brosbe) Jeff will be returning to his position mid-

December and Cheryl will support his transition back. Cheryl reported that her outreach has

resulted in six new jobs and more 3rd shift workers.

Linda Melvin posed the question - can wall/floor renters work the receptions in lieu of general

staffing? Some have expressed discomfort in working alone in the gallery and handling

money. It was agreed this is a gallery committee topic.

Monthly Show - Sharon Hoffman reported that although there was a lot of rain, the November

monthly show brought in 84 pieces of art for the small images show with 25-30 regular

submissions! The gallery took in approximately \$1200 with the show and sold roughly

\$1300-1400 at the reception.

Gallery Chair Report - Terry Oshrin reported that there was no meeting this month

Hospitality - Marissa Wright was absent. It was discussed that currently Marissa has a \$250

budget per reception. Marissa works hard to make the budget work, even growing herbs in her

own garden to save the guild money.

Motion: Terry Oshrin moved to raise the reception hospitality budget to \$300; Cheryl DeLain

seconded the motion. With one abstention, and zero nays, the motion was passed.

Newsletter - Sharon Hoffman reported that the newsletter is in progress. A discussion of

various "articles" in the Paint Rag and their effectiveness/timeliness led to brainstorming how

to ask visitors and buying customers to please review our gallery on Yelp. Judy Salinsky will look into how we can text customers with a yelp review link after their visit.

The Board discussed various outreach methods and thanked Deborah Buffington for steering the

Daytripper bus tour guide to Off Track Gallery, where they now regularly send their tours!

Motion: Cheryl DeLain moved to adjourn the meeting; Janet Weinstein seconded. All in favor,

meeting adjourned 11:02.



Rules for Monthly Show

INFORMATION ABOUT THE MONTHLY SHOW

BEFORE YOU BRING YOUR ENTRIES TO THE MONTHLY SHOW, PLEASE ...

- If your work is on a wrapped canvas, make sure that the edges are painted also.
 All wall art must have D or triangle brackets and wire, NOT SAWTOOTH HANGERS. SCREW EYES
- 3. The brackets need to be placed on each side about one quarter of the way down the 4. The wire should be tight enough so that when the art is hung, the picture hanger will
- 5. The edges of the wire need to be toped to protect against injury.

NOTE THAT DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON SOME SHOWS ARE SHORTENED AND PRO-RATED SO FEES CHANGE FOR THOSE SHOWS.

Wall artwork for the Monthly Show is divided into these entry fee categories:

- 1) under 17" measured on the diagonal: \$12
- between 18" and 32" measured on the diagonal: \$17
 over 33" to 48" measured on the diagonal: \$25
- 4) anything measuring over 48" will be accepted at the discretion of the onthly show chair

All Monthly Show entries must remain on display for the entire month unless sold. They may then be replaced with a similar size and type of artwork

San Dieguito Art Guild to host Holiday Bazaar Dec. 14

San Dieguito Art Guild presents its ninth annual Holiday Bazaar on Saturday, Dec. 14, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., at the Encinitas Community Center, 1140 Oakcrest Park Drive (corner of Encinitas Blvd and Balour), Encinitas.

The San Dieguito Art Guild, an over-200-member all-volunteer nonprofit organization that operates the Off Track Gallery located in the Lumberyard Shopping Center in Encinitas, serves the community by frequently offering art workshops, classes and demonstrations by outstanding professional artists.

Run by a board of 15 elected directors, SDAG was organized in 1965 by a group of artists for the purpose of promoting greater understanding and appreciation of the fine arts.

Carol Korfin, one of the event organizers, says, "This event gives local artists a venue to offer their hand-made items to the public. And gives the shoppers a chance to purchase one-of-a-kind artworks, which cannot be found in the malls. There are no imported items at this Bazaar. In addition, the buyer is purchasing work directly from the artist and can meet them face to face."

Guild President Linda Melvin says, "Even if you have been to our Holiday Bazaar in the past, there are new artists and new items to see. We try to have a balanced mix of

medium, so you will find photographers, watercolorists, oil or acrylic painters as well as multi-media artists."

There will be a silent auction of artworks donated by the participating artists. Karen Fidel, ceramic artist says, "Our artwork is special because it is from all local artists and often of local scenes. Our Bazaar features really special deals on silent auction items where the proceeds help support our Off Track Gallery."

The event also features yummy treats, raffle, art for sale by artists: paintings, jewelry, photography, glass, ceramics, mosaics, fiber art, cards, prints and more.
